The October Surprise tracking program

This presentation is based on the third of four weekly national surveys tracking the attitudes of likely voters prior to the November 2nd, 2010 midterm elections.

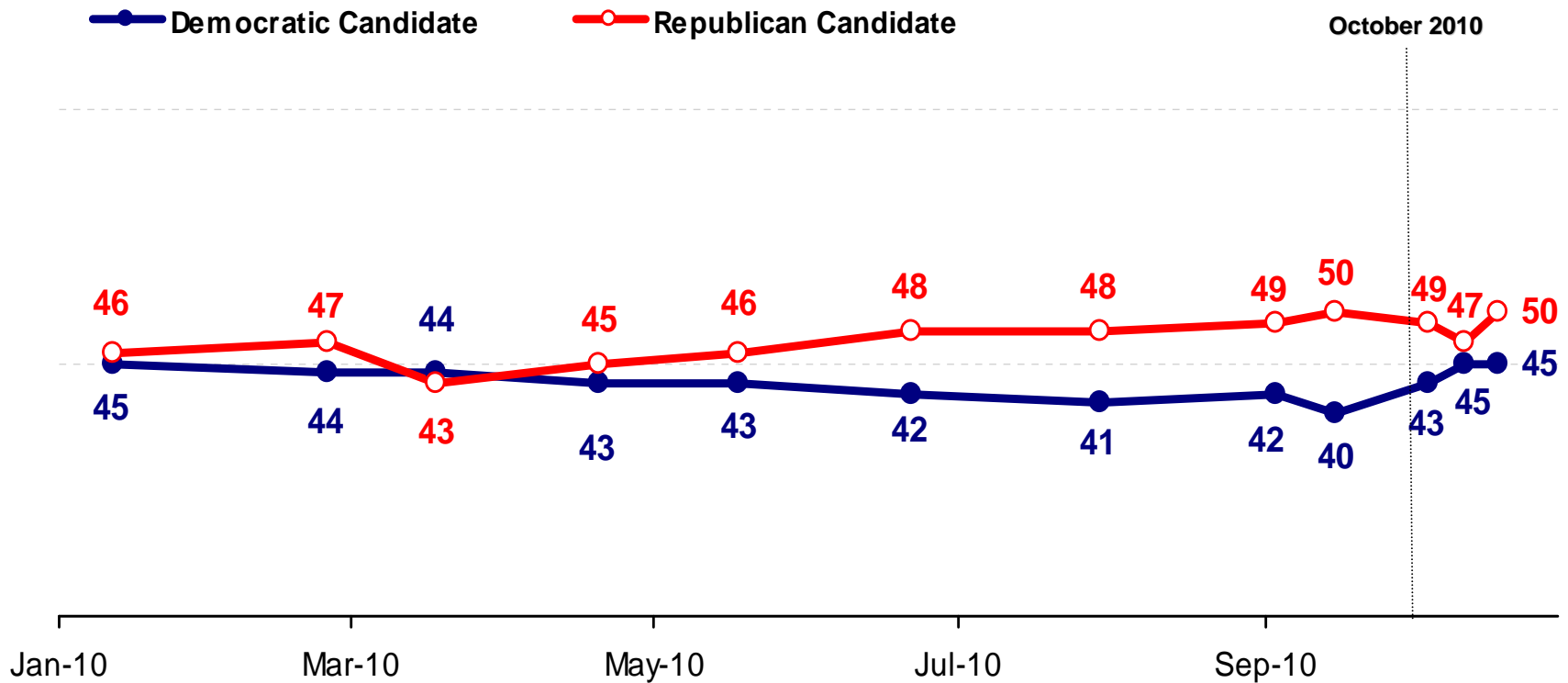
This survey was conducted by Greenberg Quinlan Rosner for Democracy Corps. The survey was of 801 likely voters (685 landline, 116 cell phone) conducted October 16-18, 2010.

The margin of error for this survey is +/- 3.2 percentage points.

Two weeks out: the vote

The congressional vote: Republicans hold small lead

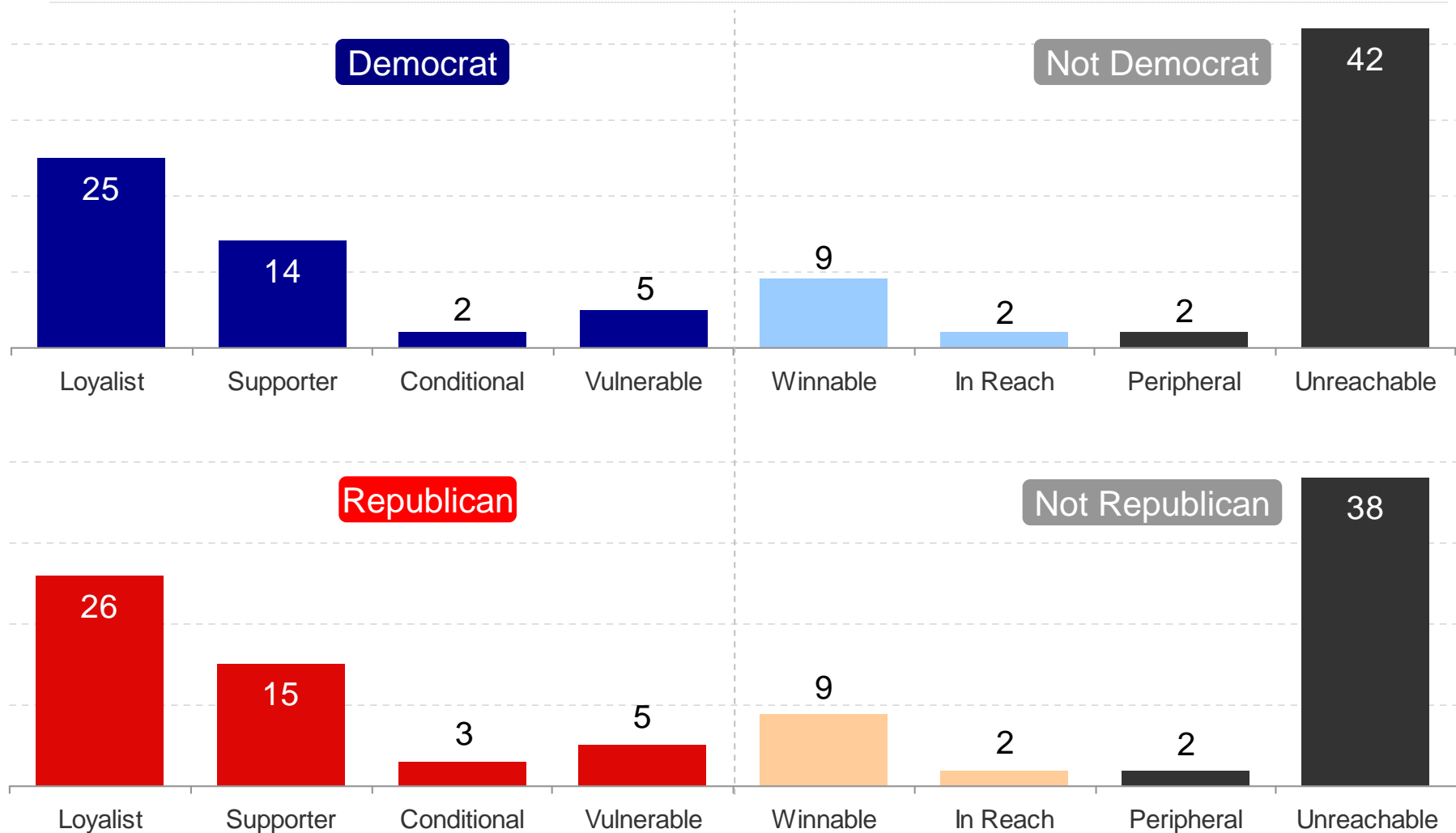

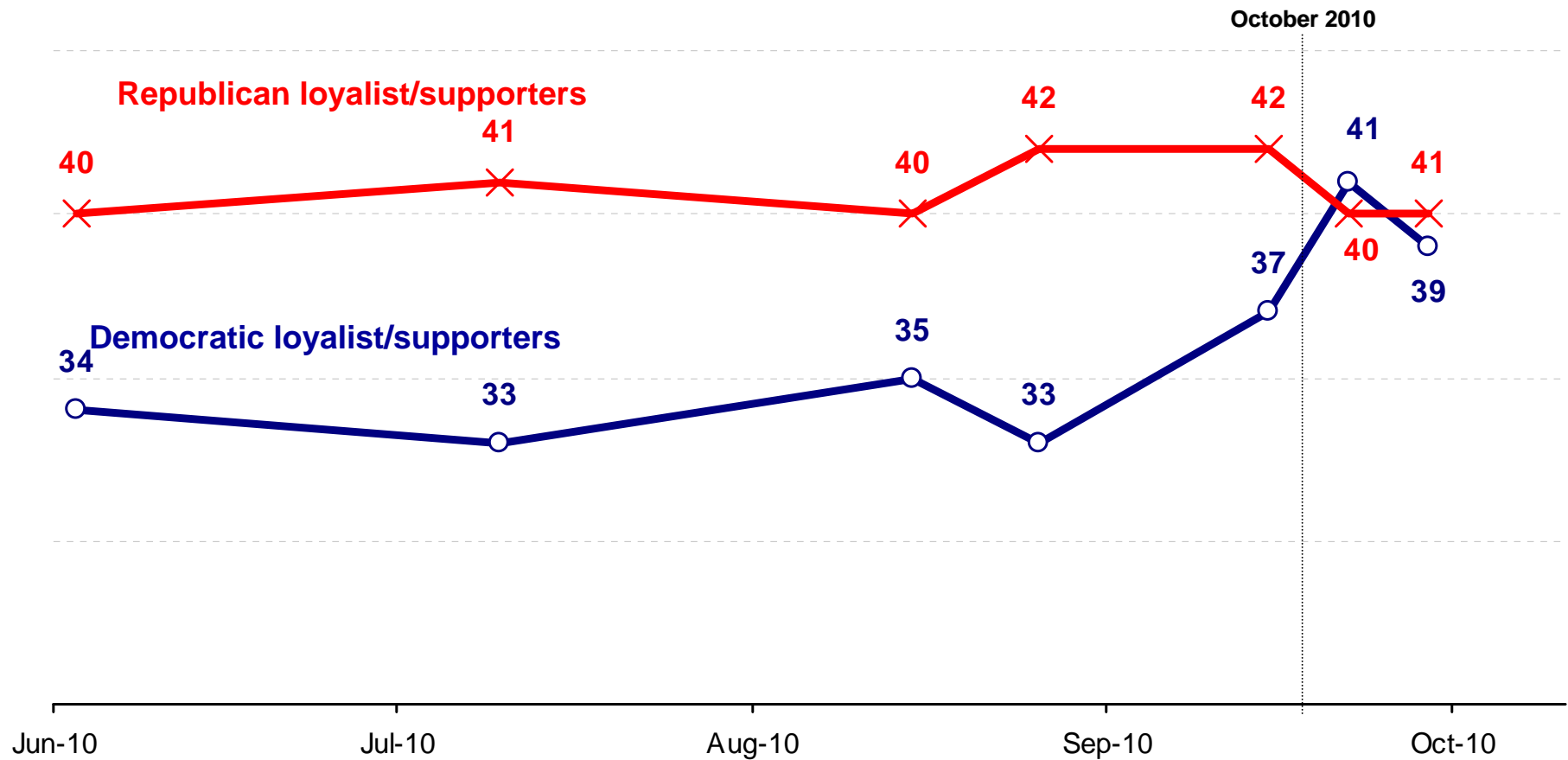

Voter choice scale: parties in similar positions to win persuadables

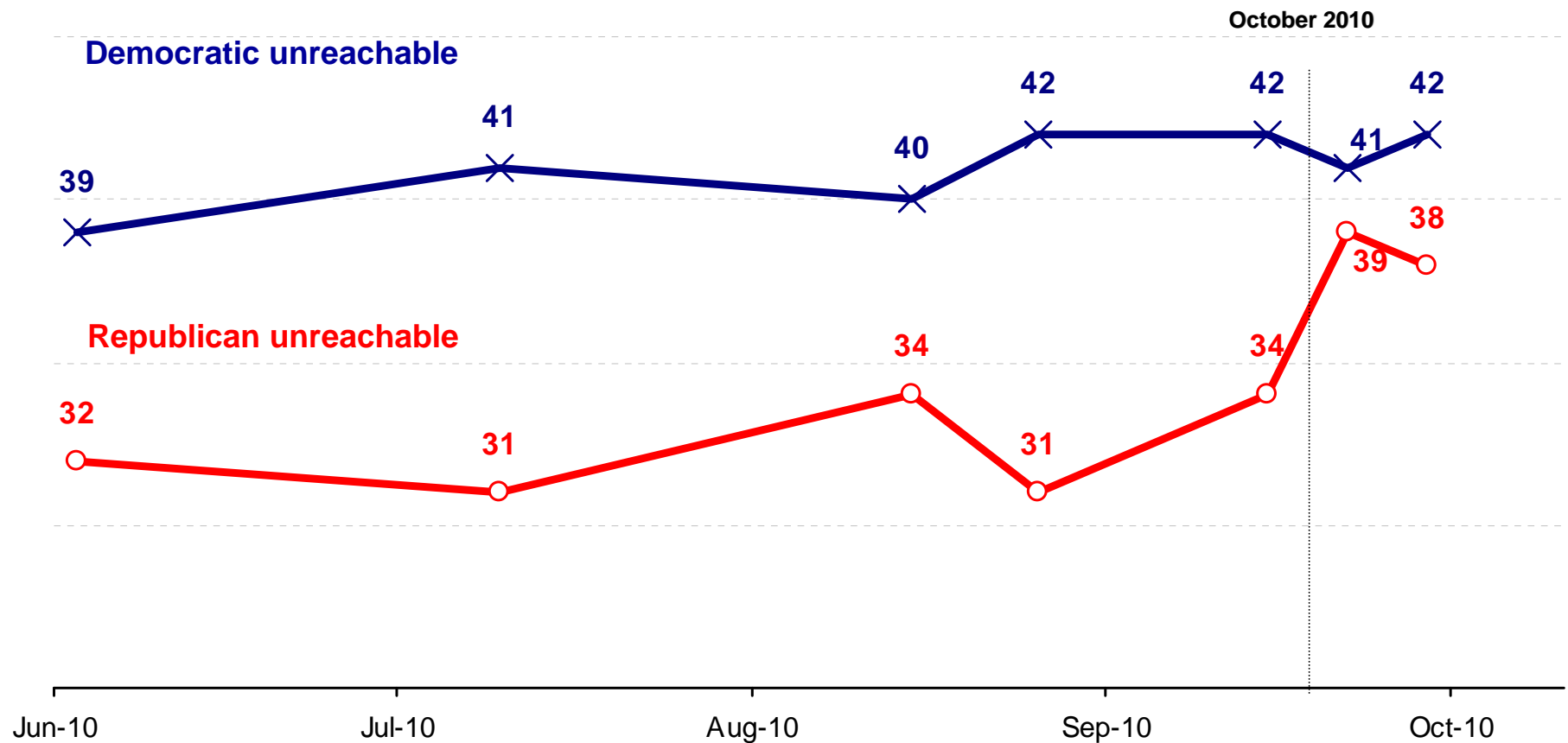


Voter choice scales: both parties hold on to equal base support

Voter choice scales: Republicans have slightly more room to grow

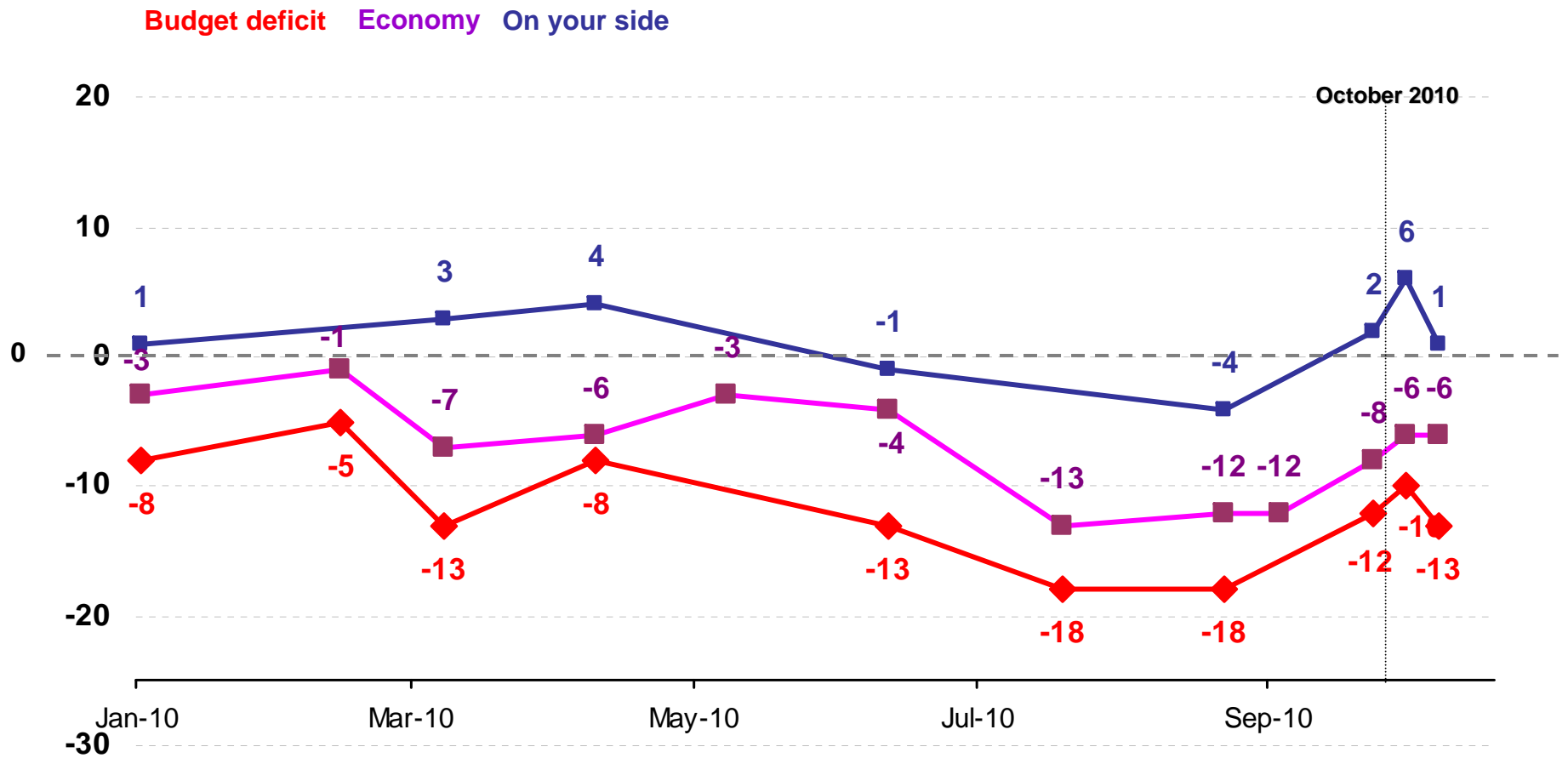

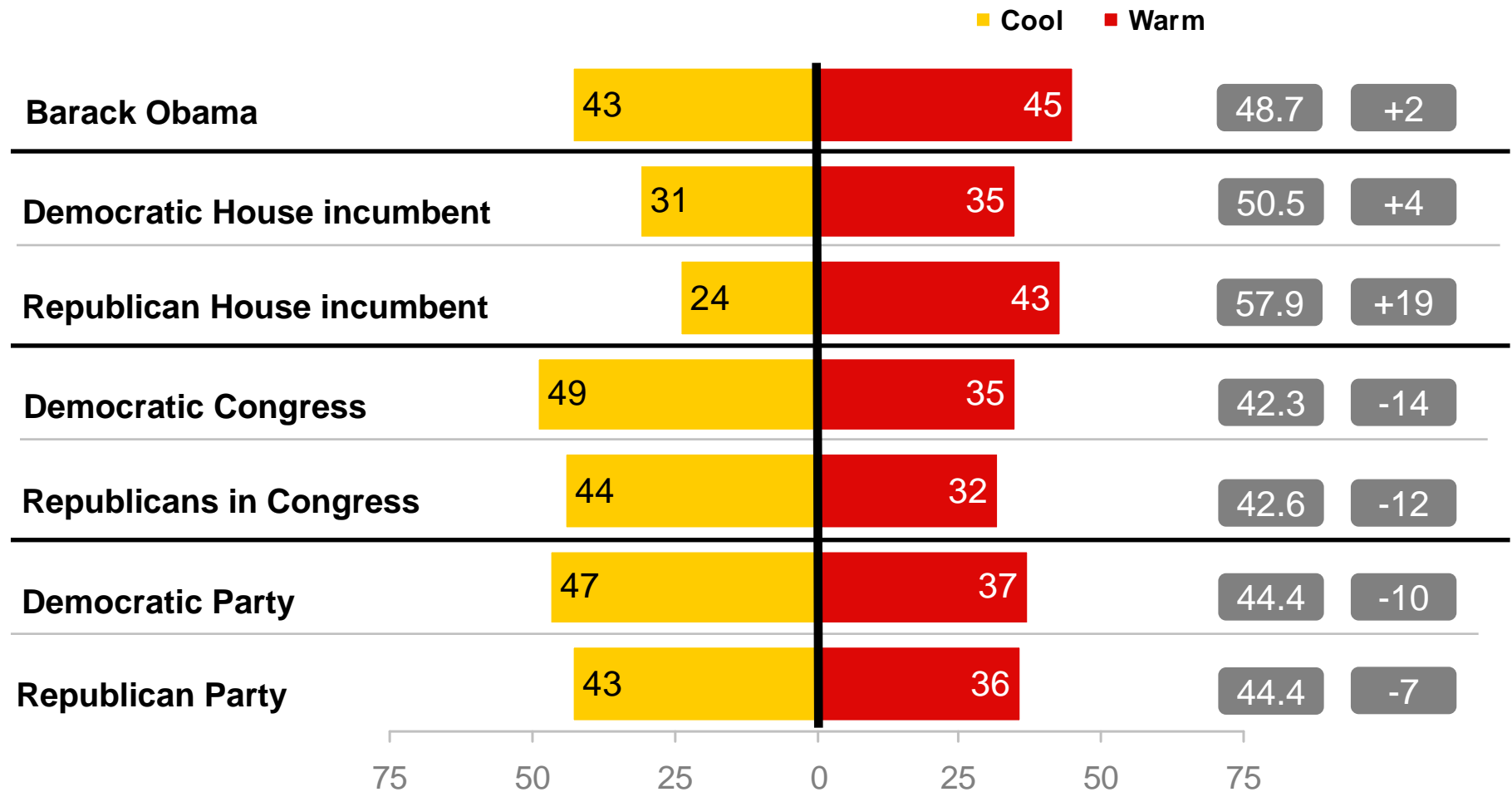

Therm. Mean **Warm - Cool**

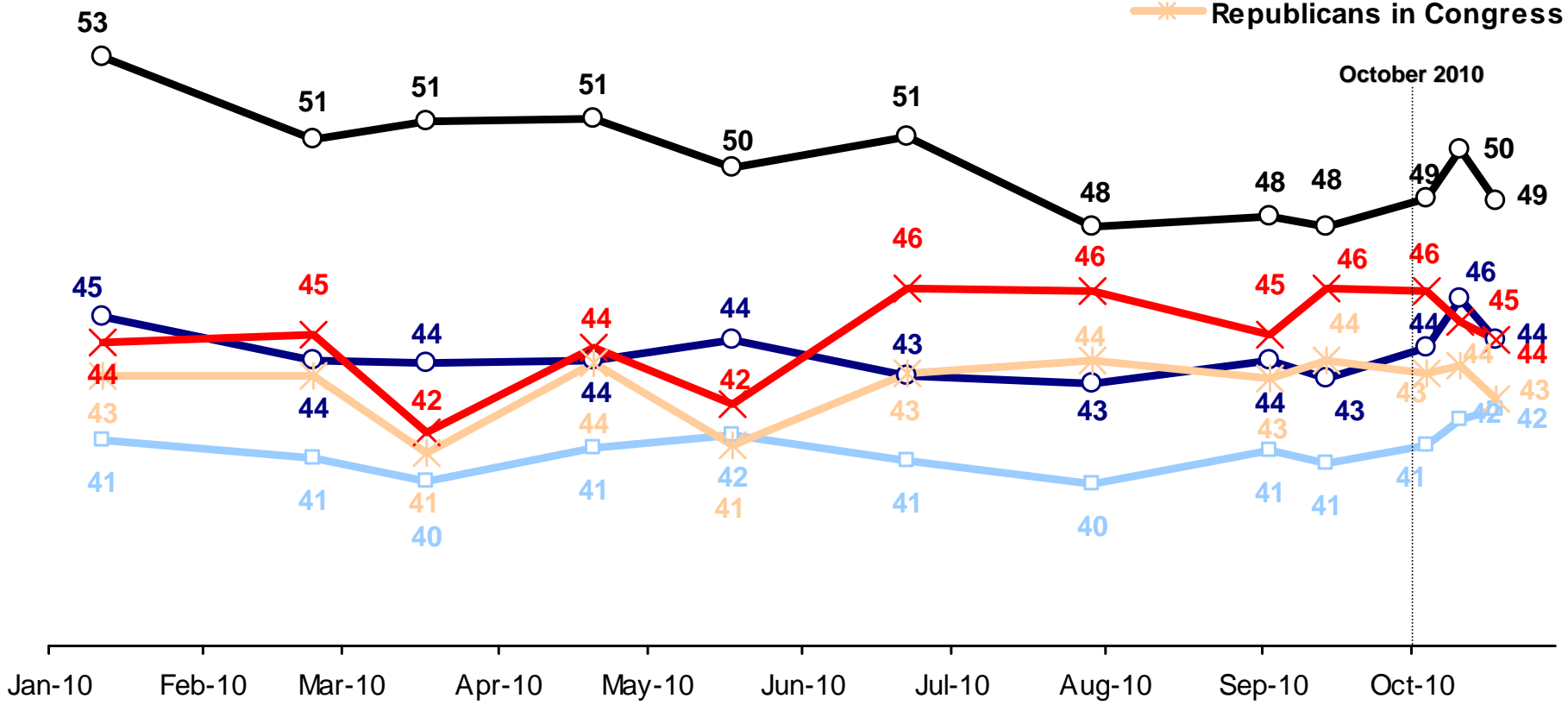

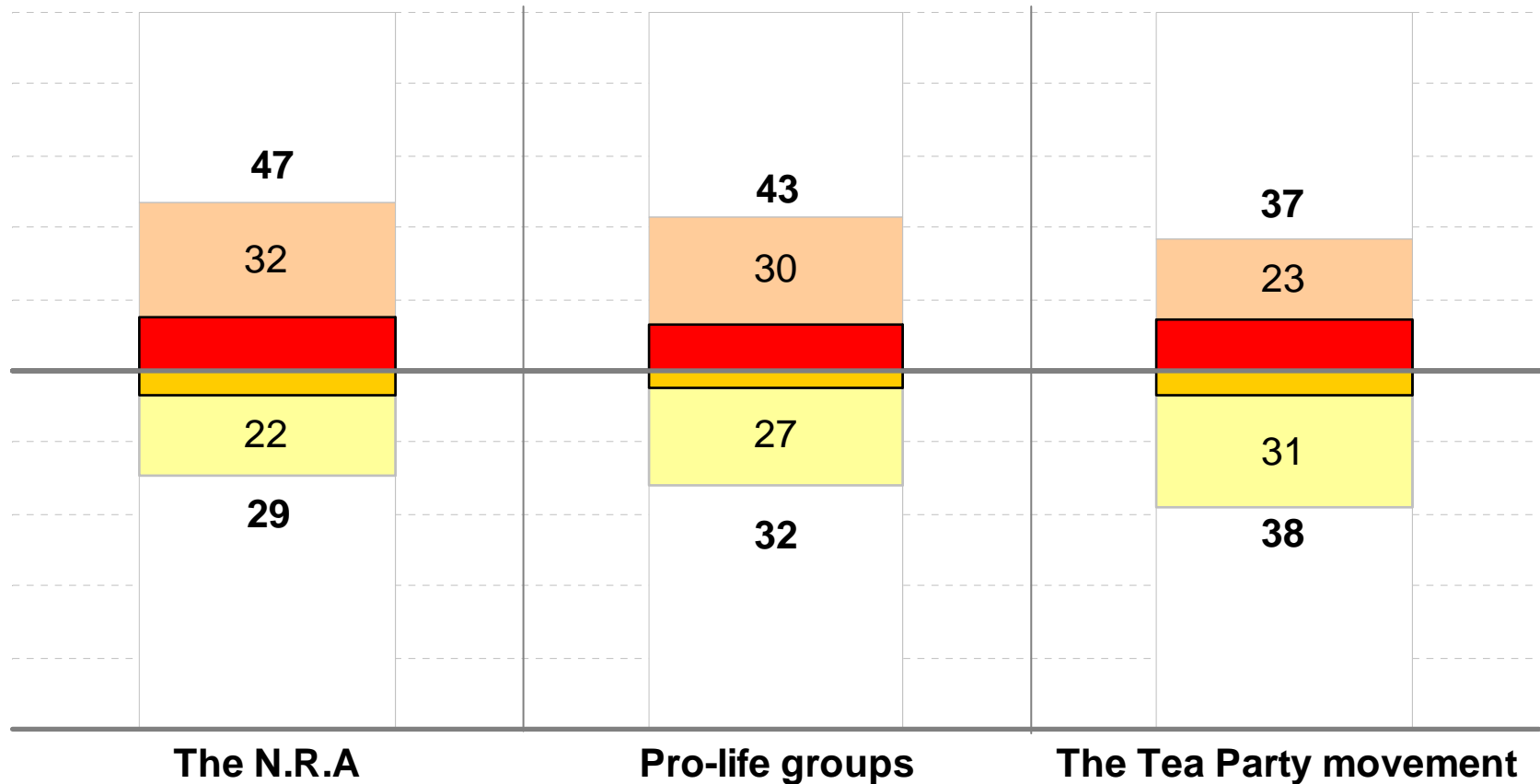

Tea Party more divisive than other conservative groups

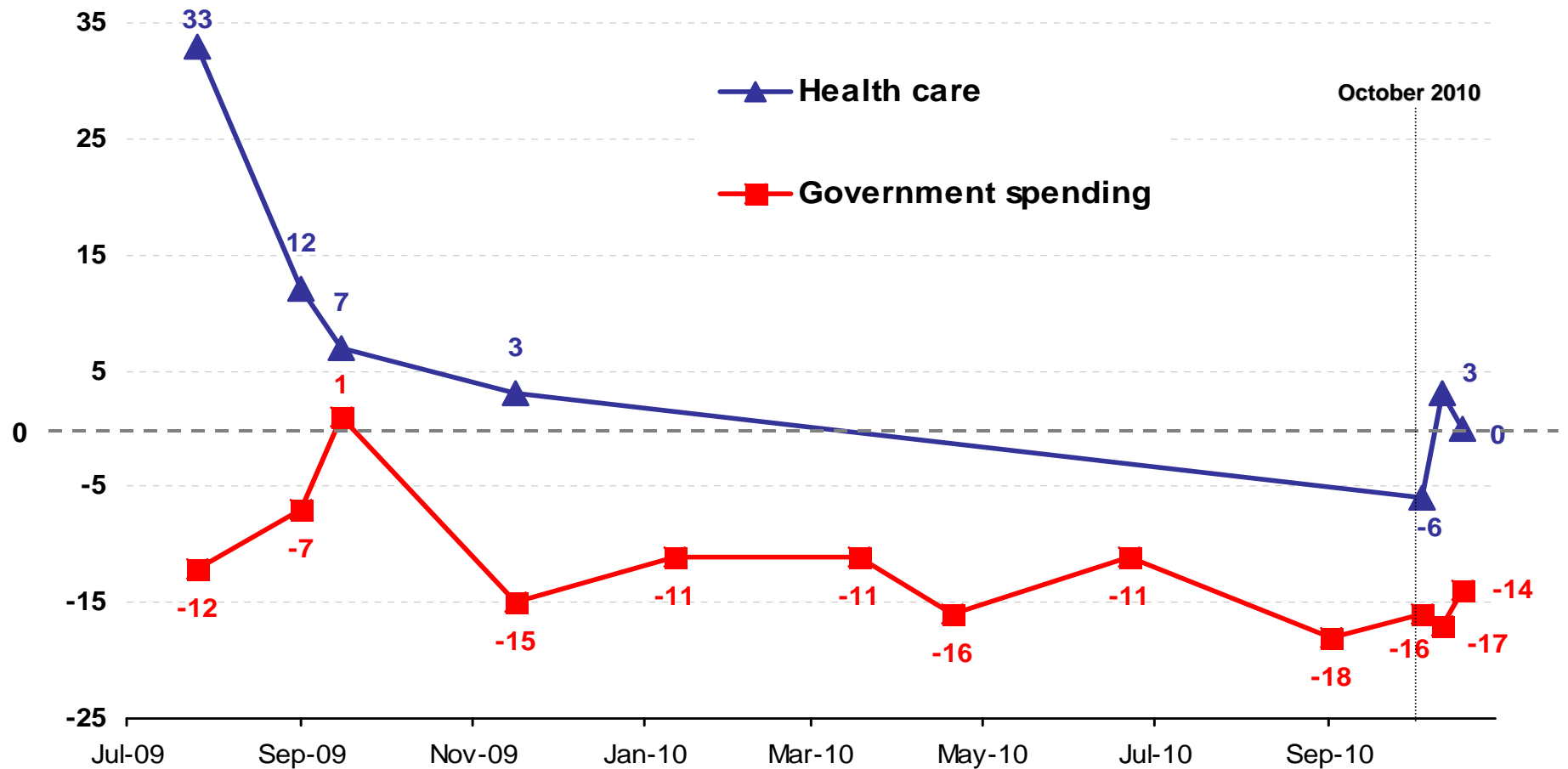
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- % warm (51-100 degrees)

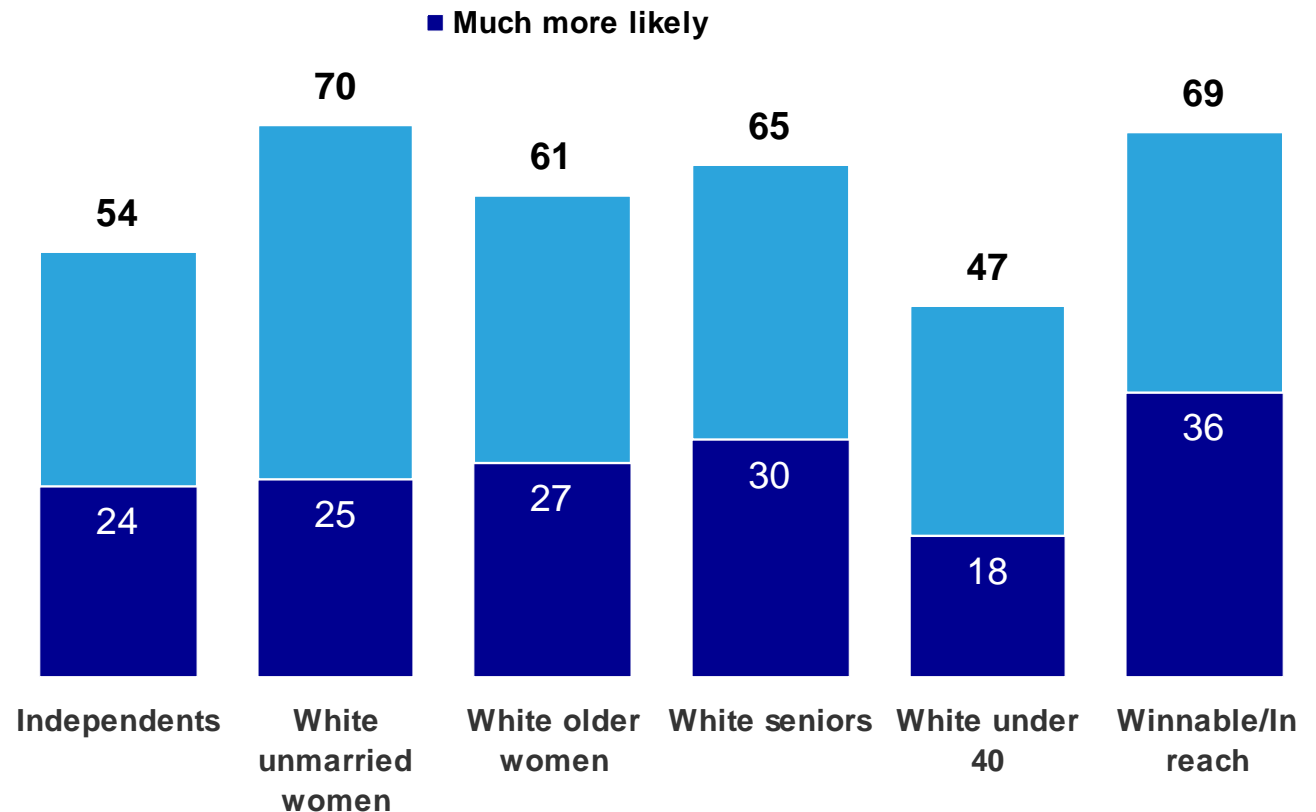
Messages and attacks that extend vote

Top messages by key groups: Reform/Special interests/Middle class

Now let me read you some statements that (DEMOCRATIC HOUSE CANDIDATE) might make this fall about the election. After I read each statement, please tell me whether each statement would make you MUCH MORE LIKELY to support the Democratic candidate this November, SOMEWHAT MORE LIKELY, JUST A LITTLE MORE LIKELY, NO MORE LIKELY, or LESS LIKELY to support (DEMOCRATIC HOUSE CANDIDATE) this November.

Reform/Special interests/Middle class

We have to change Washington. That means eliminating the special deals and tax breaks won by corporate lobbyists for the oil companies and Wall Street, paid for with higher deficits. (REPUBLICAN HOUSE CANDIDATE) has pledged to protect those breaks for Wall Street CEOs, oil companies like BP and companies that ship our jobs to India and China. I'll take a different approach by cutting taxes for the middle class and small businesses so they can start creating jobs again. Let's make our country work for the middle class.

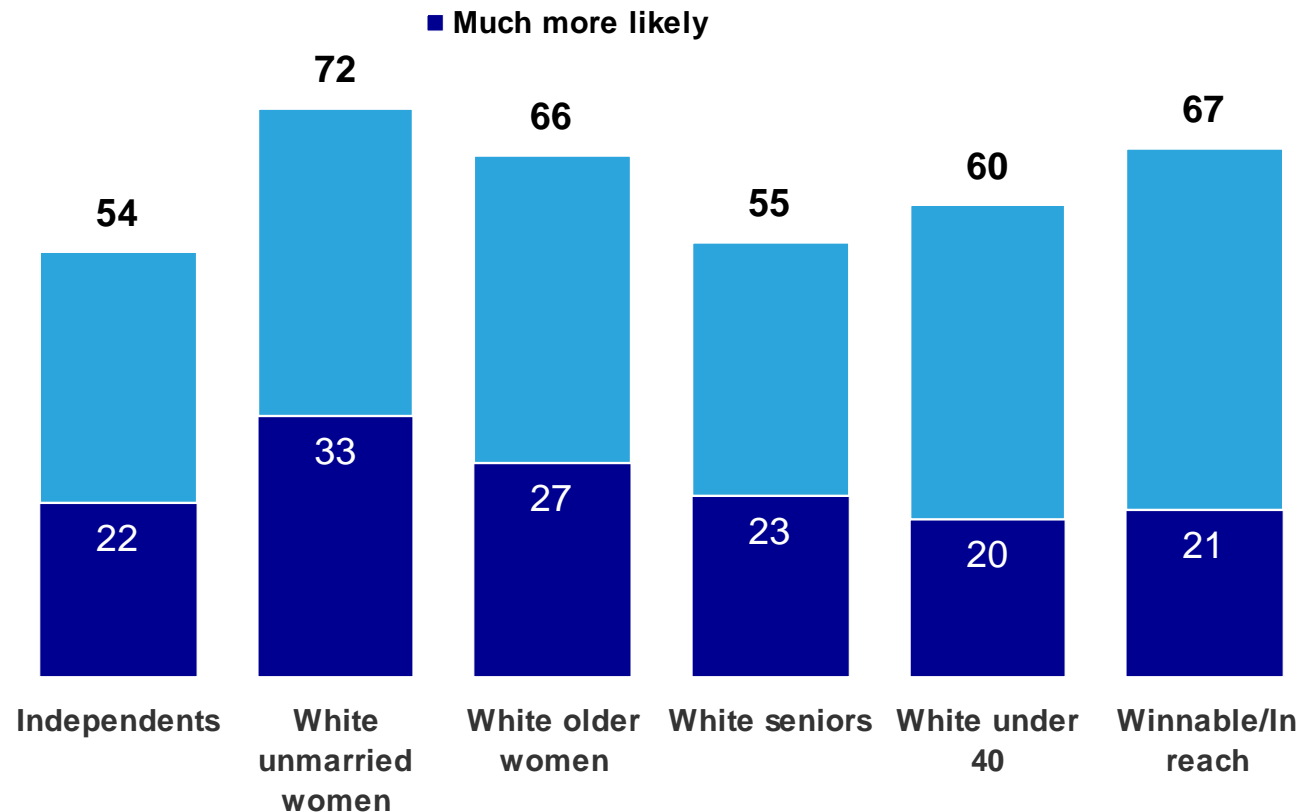


Top messages by key groups: Made in America/American jobs

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Made in America/American jobs

My passion is "made in America," working to support small businesses, American companies and new American industries. (REPUBLICAN HOUSE CANDIDATE) opposed efforts to make it easier for small businesses to get credit and has pledged to support job-killing free trade deals and to protect tax breaks for companies that send American jobs to places like India and China. I have a different approach: cutting taxes for companies that create jobs right here in American and helping small business expand and hire new workers by cutting red tape and making it easier for them to get credit.

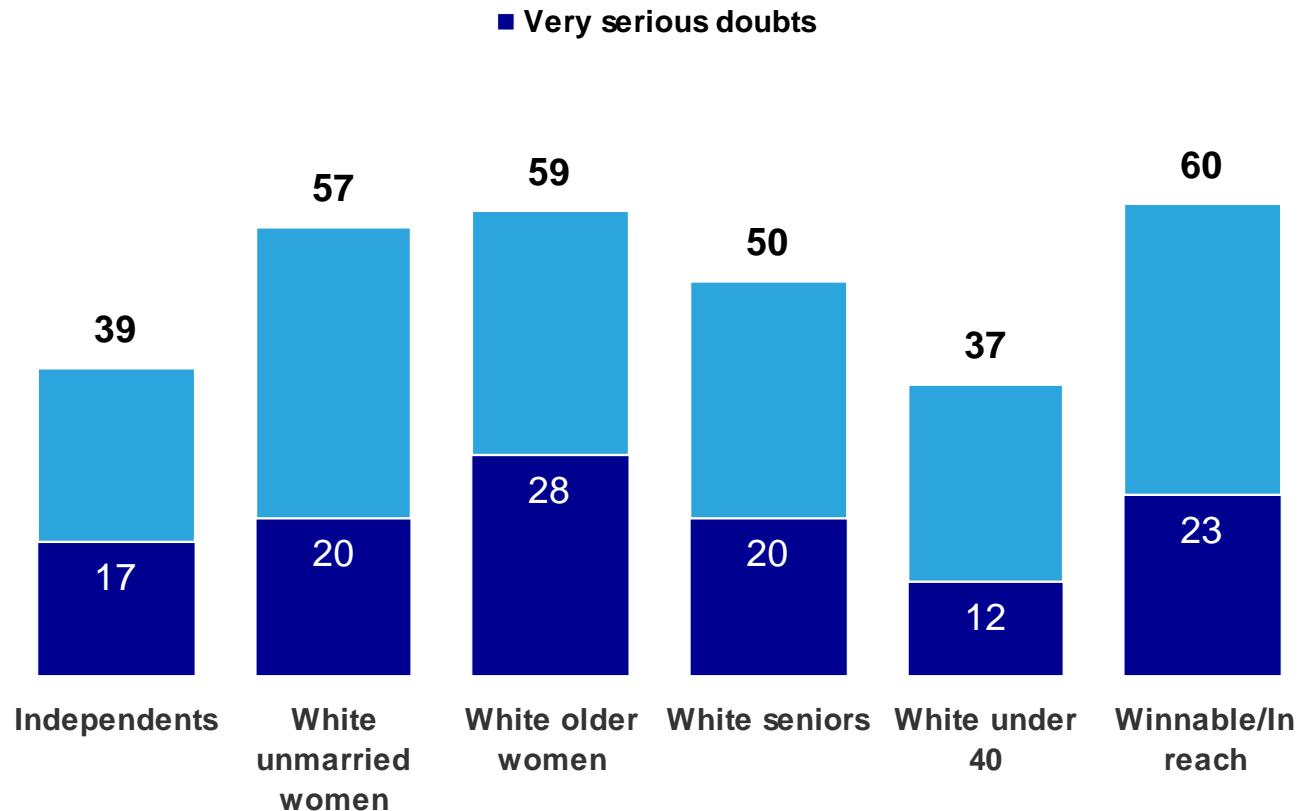


Strongest attacks on Republicans: Social Security/Medicare

Social Security/Medicare

(REPUBLICAN HOUSE CANDIDATE) has pledged to make sweeping cuts, including cuts to programs for the middle class, like Social Security and Medicare. The Republican plan to privatize Social Security shifts savings to the stock market and ends guaranteed benefit levels. Medicare as we know it will end, as seniors will have to purchase private insurance using a voucher.

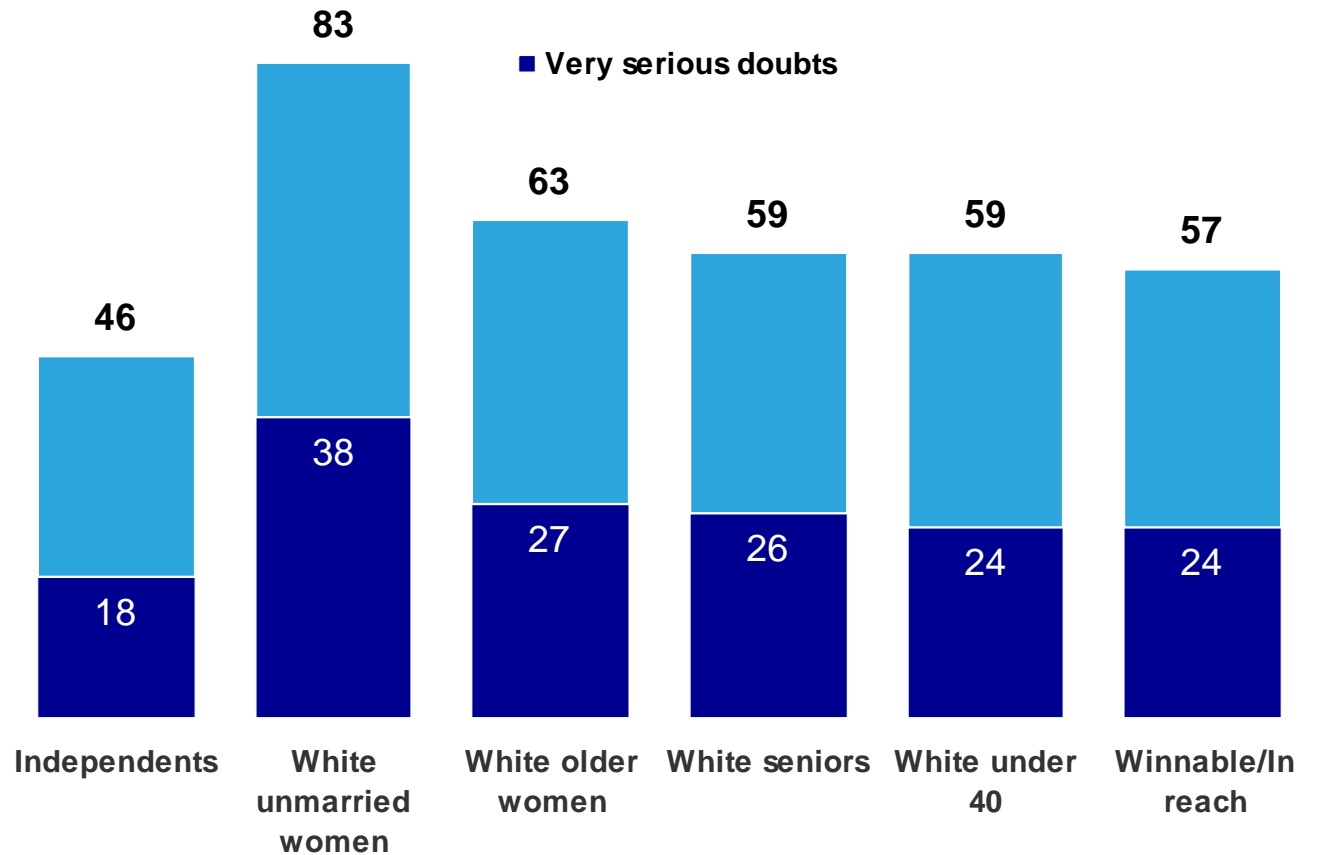


Strongest attacks on Republicans: Fair Tax

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Fair tax

(REPUBLICAN HOUSE CANDIDATE) supports the eliminating of taxes on big corporations and wants a new twenty-three percent national sales tax on nearly everything we buy, including groceries, medicine, clothes, and gas, which would hit the middle class hard.



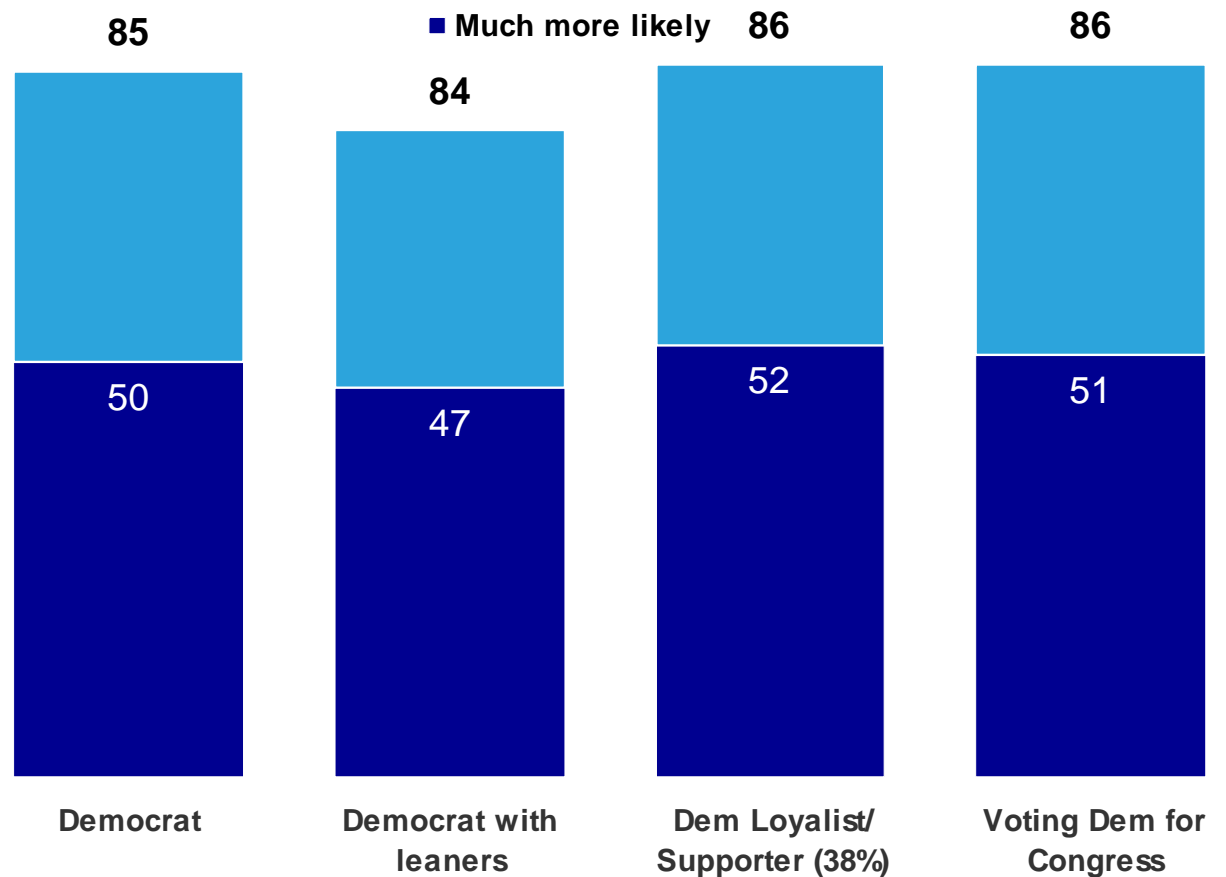

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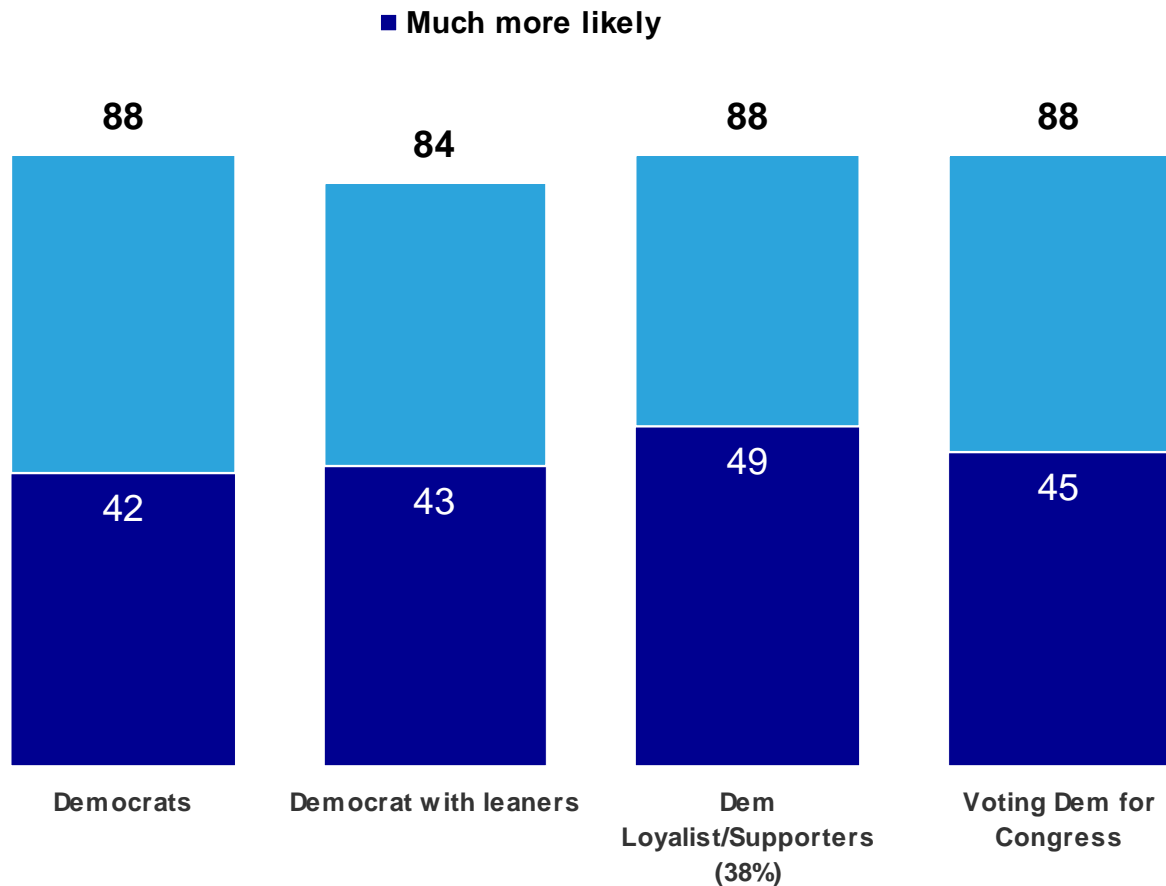


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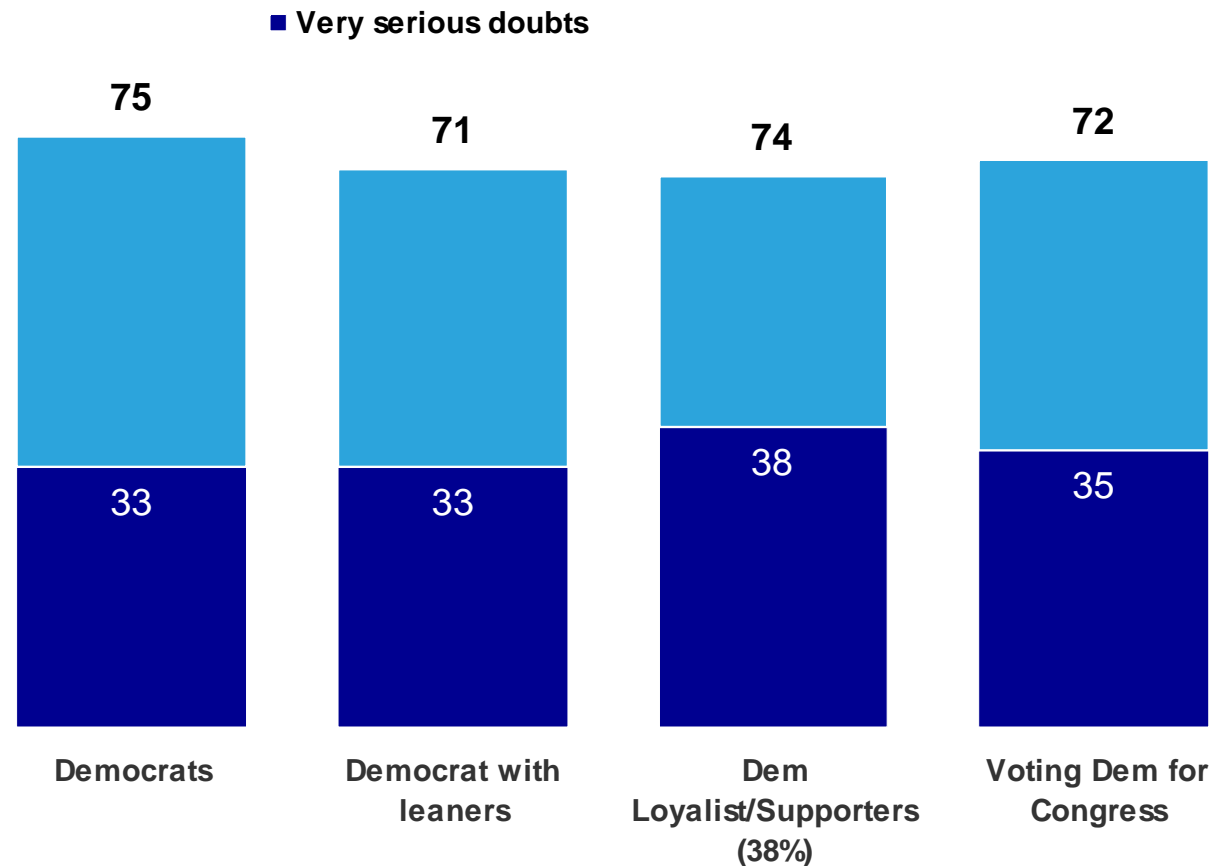


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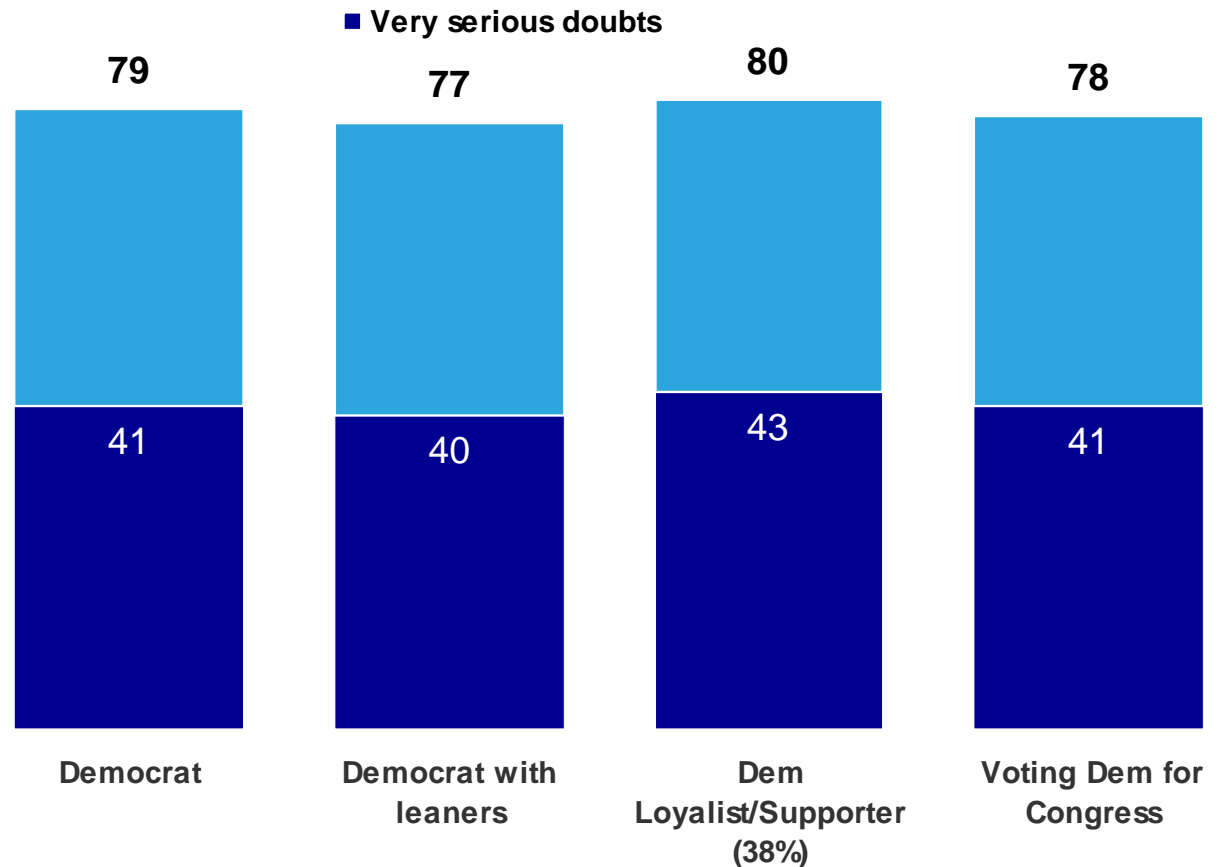


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Fair Tax

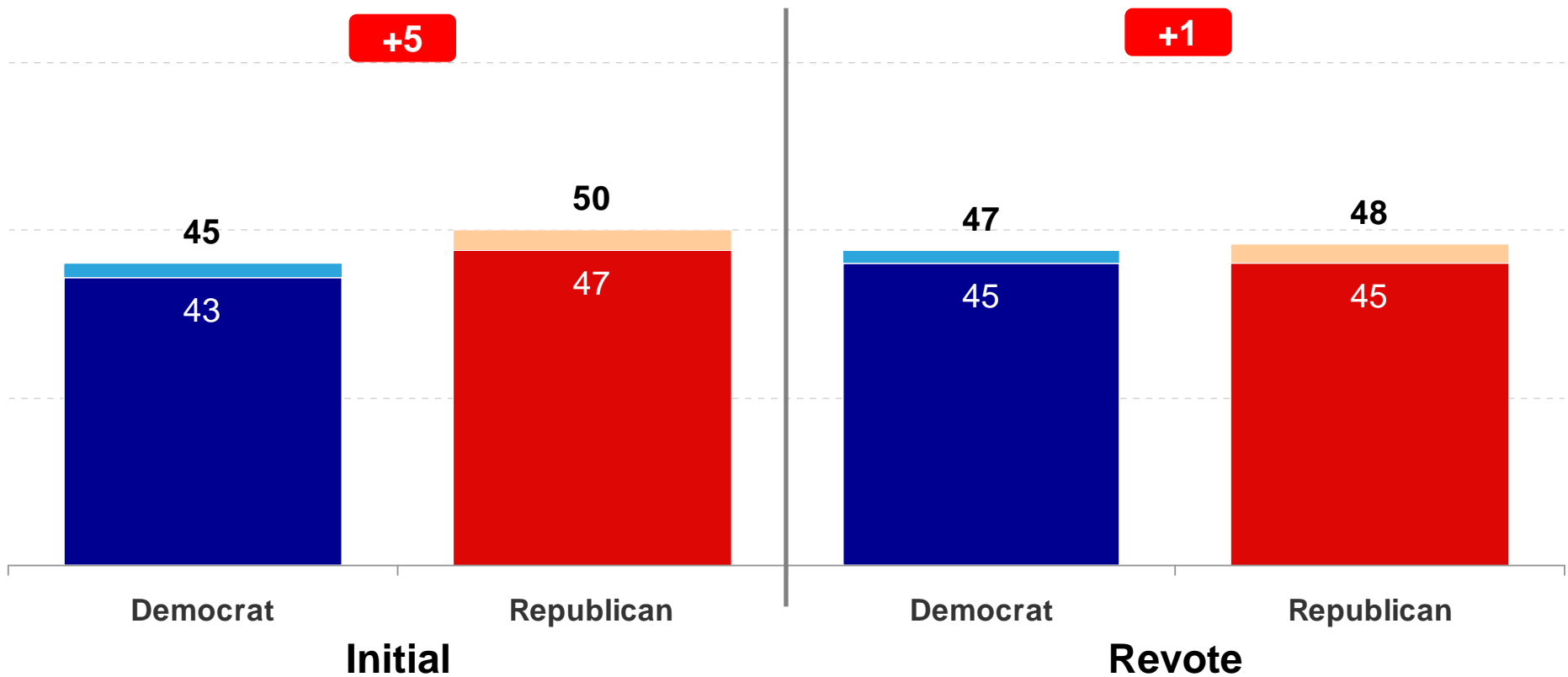
