This plan prohibits insurance companies from denying coverage for pre-existing conditions or dropping coverage when someone gets sick and requires them to cover preventive care. It creates a health insurance exchange where individuals without insurance can purchase a private plan or a public insurance option.

The plan requires all Americans to purchase health insurance or pay a penalty, while subsidizing the cost for those with low and moderate incomes. It requires all companies to provide health insurance for their employees or contribute to a fund that will help pay for their coverage with small businesses being exempted.

The plan will cost 900 billion dollars over 10 years. It is paid for by cutting spending on Medicare and Medicaid by 500 billion dollars and by taxing insurance companies on their most expensive policies. To ensure it won't increase the deficit, the plan requires further spending cuts if promised savings don't materialize.
